

### 2022 SDMTA Online Guest Judges and Presenter



**Dr. Hedi Salanki-Rubardt**, Distinguished University Professor and director of piano and chamber music, teaches piano and harpsichord performance, keyboard interpretation, musical structure and style, and chamber music. She is also recognized as a Yamaha Artist.

Salanki-Rubardt has gained worldwide recognition for her diverse repertoire of solo and chamber music for the piano and harpsichord. Her playing has been distinguished by its naturalness, grace and a feeling of flow.

Always in demand as a performer, judge and lecturer, some of her recent engagements include the San Jose International Baroque Festival in Costa Rica; World Piano Conference in Serbia; piano competition in Kunming, China; the Lancaster International Piano Festival, lecture-

recitals in Chengdu and Guangzhou and a teaching invitation from the Internarmony International Music Festival in Germany.

She has played with the New Jersey Symphony, New York Chamber Orchestra, I Solisti New York, Syracuse Symphony, Pensacola Symphony, Mobile Symphony and others. She has also performed solo, duo and lecture recitals all over the world, including Europe, Canada, Japan, China, Central America and New Zealand.

She has recorded many significant works of Johann Sebastian Bach, including the "Goldberg Variations" (nominated for Ovation Magazine's Debut Artist of the Year Award), the "Concerti," and the complete "English Suites." She has also recorded Scarlatti sonatas, Telemann overtures, and a French Baroque program.

As founding artistic director of the Four Seasons Baroque Ensemble, she garnered critical acclaim for artistic excellence and innovative programming.

In 2015, she was named a Yamaha Artist for maintaining the highest standards in piano performance and education.





Pianist **Anne Madison** is a passionate performer and educator. She holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, a Master of Music degree from Baylor University, and an Artist Diploma from the Vienna Conservatory in Vienna, Austria, where she concertized regularly as a soloist and collaborator. Since returning to the United States, Madison has appeared on concert series in England, Austria, and the American Midwest. As an orchestral soloist, she has performed works by Rachmaninoff and

Saint-Saëns and was honored to play the world premiere of American composer Jackson Berkey's Piano Concerto-Easter 2015. Madison has appeared both as a soloist and a keyboardist with the Omaha Symphony and has performed and taught in connection with its educational outreach programs. She is active as a clinician, speaker, and adjudicator, and her recordings have been included on a number of compact disks.

Instructing students continues to be a deeply meaningful focus of her career. Madison serves as Chair of the Piano Department at Omaha Conservatory of Music, where she has been a member of the artist faculty since 2001. Additionally, she has taught regularly on the faculty of the Tyrolean International Piano Academy in Innsbruck, Austria and recently joined the artist faculty of the InterHarmony Festival in Acqui Terme, Italy for its 2022 season.

Timothy Woods is Northern State University's director of choral activities. He conducts the Concert Choir, the Chamber Singers, the Early Musick Ensemble, and teaches music history, conducting, and voice. He is also the Program Coordinator for the Master of Music Education. Dr. Woods received his Master and Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting at the University of Arizona. There he studied conducting with Drs. Maurice Skones, Kenneth Jennings, Jerry McCoy, Josef Knott, and Professor Thomas Hilbish, and studied voice with Dr. Larry Day.

Dr. Woods serves as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator throughout the region, and has performed tenor solos with the Arizona Opera, Tucson Symphony, Denver Symphony Orchestra, Sounds of South Dakota, and is scheduled to be a soloist again in this December's "Christmas on the Prairie" at St. Anthony's in Hoven with South Dakota Symphony.







C.J. Kocher is Professor of Saxophone and Jazz Studies at the University of South Dakota. He is active as both a classical and jazz saxophonist. He has performed with the South Dakota Symphony, Sioux City Symphony, Colorado Music Festival Orchestra, and others. With pianist Ryan Frane he formed the Frane-Kocher Duo, performing jazz standards and original music. He also performs with the Sempre Saxophone Quartet and is a member of the Kocher Duo with his wife Stephanie (flute and saxophone). Kocher has premiered new works at World Saxophone Congresses and North American Saxophone Alliance events. He has toured Japan three times, playing lead alto with the Billy Vaughn Orchestra. He has also played with the Smithsonian Jazz Masterworks Orchestra, Frank Mantooth, Matt Wilson, Steve Wiest, Denis DiBlasio, Al Jarreau, and others. Kocher completed the Doctor of

Arts degree at the University of Northern Colorado and also holds degrees from Wichita State University and Washburn University.

Holly Haddad is a native of Roanoke, Virginia. She received her Bachelor of Music degree from the

University of North Carolina School of the Arts, her Master of Music degree with an emphasis in clarinet performance, music theory, and composition from Ohio University, and her Doctor of Musical Arts degree with an emphasis in clarinet performance/contemporary music and music theory from The University of Arizona. Her major teachers include Robert Listokin, David Lewis, and Jerry Kirkbride.



Holly has performed throughout the United States, Europe, and Mexico as a recitalist,

soloist with orchestra, and chamber musician. She has appeared in venues ranging from Lincoln Center in New York, to the historic Gewandhaus in Leipzig, Germany. Before relocating to Vermillion, South Dakota in 2004, she was an Assistant Professor of Music at Southern Utah University as well as a performer with the Tony® award winning Utah Shakespearean Festival. Currently, Holly is an academic advisor at the University of South Dakota where she works primarily with pre-med students. When she is not busy playing music or working with college students, Holly enjoys spending time with her family and friends and volunteering in her community. She has been the principal clarinetist of the Sioux City (IA) Municipal Band since 2015 and the principal clarinetist of the Sioux City (IA) Symphony since 2005.





Matthew Erickson is the Trombone and Euphonium instructor at Augustana University. He also conducts the Augustana Trombone Choir and Augustana Brass Choir. Erickson earned a Bachelor of Music Education from the University of South Dakota and Master of Music in trombone performance at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. From 2000-2022, he served as a trombonist in the United States Air Force Bands in Nebraska, Massachusetts, Texas and Germany. Throughout his Air Force career, he performed more than 1,800 engagements, appeared on or produced 10 recordings and entertained millions of civilian and military listeners, including five United States presidents and many leaders of foreign countries.

As a bass trombone soloist, Erickson has been featured with the Nebraska Jazz Orchestra, several University wind ensembles, and on eight national tours with Air Force Bands. In March of 2014, Erickson was invited to perform the Chris Brubeck Bass Trombone Concerto with the New England Conservatory Symphonic Winds in Boston's famed Jordan Hall to open the College Band Directors National Association Regional Conference.

Erickson has a keen interest in brass chamber music and arranging. From 2012-13, he served as the music director and conductor of the Bay Colony Brass. He led the 21-member ensemble in community concerts at various venues throughout Boston. As an arranger, Erickson's transcriptions have been performed by hundreds of brass ensembles, big bands and trombone choirs across the country. Erickson has presented masterclasses throughout the United States, Europe, Africa, and Southeast Asia, ranging from trombone pedagogy to brass ensemble performance.

Erickson has performed with San Antonio Symphony, Omaha Symphony Orchestra, Kansas City Symphony, Lincoln (NE) Symphony Orchestra, Sioux City (IA) Symphony, South Dakota Symphony, Bay Colony Brass, Nebraska Jazz Orchestra, and numerous brass chamber ensembles. He has served on the faculty of Iowa Western Community College and maintains a successful private trombone studio. Erickson is a S.E. Shires Performing Artist.





Ioana Galu, a native of Romania, has enjoyed a national and international career in both Europe and the United States. She earned her bachelor's and master's degrees in violin performance from the Gheorghe Dima Music Academy in Cluj, Romania, later joining the faculty as an assistant professor of violin and chamber music. After coming to the United States, she earned a second master's degree in violin performance from Bowling Green State University and continued her studies at the University of Cincinnati's College Conservatory of Music, where she received an Artist Diploma. In 2012, Galu graduated with a doctorate in Contemporary Music from Bowling Green State University. Her most important teachers were Victoria Nicolae, Alexandru Gavrilovici, Vasile Beluska, Yim Won Bin and Penny Thompson Kruse. Galu has performed in masterclasses for the Voces String Quartet, the Amernet String Quartet, Duo Gelland, Alexandru Gavrilovici, David Erlich, Stefan Milenkovich, Annette-Barbara Vogel, Kiss Ladislau, Trio

Kadek, Jacques Saint-Yves, Sherban Lupu, Devics Sandor, Laura Kobayashi and Wolfram Just. In 2000, she earned a scholarship at the Academie National de Villecroze of France and studied with Diana Ligeti and Christian Ivaldi. She has been awarded prizes in several national and international competitions, including Second Prize in the Mozart International Competition for Piano Trios (Romania), and First Prize and Special Prize of the SOROS Foundation at the George Enescu Violin National Competition (Romania). She also won Second Prize in the Starling Violin Competition College Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati (CCM) and was the winner of the CCM Concerto Competition in February 2004. Galu has performed recitals in Romania, Budapest (Hungary), Düsseldorf (Germany), Lyon, Villecroze (France), Bowling Green, Toledo, Greensboro, Cincinnati and New York City. She has appeared as soloist with several orchestras in Romania and the United States, including the CCM Orchestra, Heidelberg University Orchestra, Jackson Symphony Orchestra, Livonia Symphony, Southern Great Lakes Symphony, Central Ohio Symphony, and the Perrysburg Symphony. Between 2006 and 2009 she served as the concertmaster of Central Ohio Symphony in Delaware, and was the concertmaster of the Southern Great Lakes Symphony Orchestra between 2010 and 2015. From 2004-2016, Galu was on the faculty of the Heidelberg University Department of Music in Tiffin, Ohio and was the director of the Preparatory Department between 2005 and 2009. She served the faculty at The College of Wooster, Ohio in 2014-2016. Galu has been on the faculty of Eastern Music Festival since 2004. In the summer of 2010, she cofounded the annual Romanian-American chamber music festival "American Musicians in Transylvania" in her hometown of Bistrita, Romania, with full support from the Society of Concerts - Bistrita. The festival brings together Romanian and American artists for chamber music concerts and masterclasses in different Transylvanian cities. In June 2013, Galu was selected to be a member of the board of directors of Music4Romania, an organization whose mission is to "make a difference through music by enhancing the conditions and educational opportunities in schools and orphanages in Romania and by promoting Romanian music and culture in the USA and internationally." (Music4Romania.org). Galu is also a member of the board of directors of the Southern Great Lakes Symphony Orchestra. In 2014 Galu performed the world premiere of Marilyn Shrude's violin concerto Libro D'Ore with the Central Ohio Symphony and the European premiere with the Sibiu State Philharmonic in Romania. She gave the US

premiere in October 2014, and subsequently recorded the concerto for Albany Records. In January 2015, Galu recorded "Music Under Political Unrest" - Works for Two Violins by Grażyna Bacewicz, Henryk Górecki, and Michał Spisak with Iuliana Cotirlea, violin, to be released in 2016. In December 2015, Galu premiered "Elegy for Peter" for viola solo, commissioned in memory of cellist Peter Kozma. In April 2016, she premiered "Unrest" for amplified violin, tape and percussion, co-written with percussionist Bridget Slone. The work expresses Galu's personal reflections on the Romanian Revolution of 1989. During the season of 2016-2017, Galu will give the European premiere of Samuel Adler's Violin Concerto in Romania.

**Dr. Susanne Skyrm** taught piano, piano literature, fortepiano, and class piano at the University of South Dakota for 28 years, retiring in 2016. She has been active in SDMTA since 1988, serving in various offices and judging for many auditions and competitions, both in South Dakota and other states. She was named an MTNA Foundation Fellow for South Dakota in 2017. She has made presentations at the SDMTA State Conference, as well as at other state MTA conferences and nationally. Her students were frequent winners in both MTNA and SDMTA competitions. She has given recitals and



presentations nationally and internationally, released two CDs of keyboard music performed on historical instruments from the collections of the National Music Museum in Vermillion, and published an anthology of early Spanish keyboard music.



**Ellen Osborn**, soprano, holds a Master of Music degree in vocal performance from the University of South Dakota. She recently opened the 2021-22 season of the Sioux City Chamber Music Association with a solo voice recital with pianist Michele Grossman. Favorite opera roles include The Fairy Godmother in Massenet's *Cinderella* and Susanna in *The Marriage of Figaro*.

She has performed with Opera Omaha, the Des Moines Metro Opera, the Sioux City Symphony Orchestra, as well as the Missouri River Choral Society, Siouxland Master Chorale, and the Des Moines Choral Society. Ms. Osborn lives in Sioux City, Iowa, where she has a private voice studio.

Christopher Hill is in his 37<sup>th</sup> season as principal clarinetist of the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra. Paul Globus, in The Clarinet magazine, calls Hill a "first rate clarinetist... whose playing is uniformly excellent." He has performed with the Baltimore Symphony, Philadelphia Orchestra, Omaha Symphony, New Sousa Band, Carousel National Tour, Evita World Tour, Jimmy Dorsey Orchestra, Binghamton Symphony, and the Rome Festival Orchestra. He has been a soloist with the SDSO, Sioux Falls Municipal Band, and other orchestras and bands, and he performed at ClarinetFest 2005, in Tokyo, Japan. He has recorded a CD of this music, and he is also featured on two recordings with the SDSO. He also performed at ClarinetFest 2012 with the Manhattan Basset Horn Trio.



Hill just retired as the conductor of the Sioux Falls Municipal Band, and has conducted the SDSO, Hunterdon Symphony, and was a rehearsal conductor for the Carousel National Tour. He has been a clinician at many universities and music schools, including The Peabody Institute, University of Minnesota, Arizona State University, University of Northern Iowa, University of Southern California, and Oakland University, and is a clarinet instructor at Augustana University. Hill holds a Bachelor and Master of Music degree from Temple University, where he was a student of Anthony Gigliotti. In addition, he has studied with Donald Montanaro, Burt Hara, Ronald Rueben, Karl Herman, David Peck, and George Silfies. A noted mouthpiece craftsman, Hill is the designer of his own line of mouthpieces.
